Pastoral Thoughts: There's Always a Future Jeremiah 29:11-13

In mid-September I spent a couple of days on the north shore of Lake Superior, the first time I'd been there in over 30 years. It was as beautiful as I remember. I recognized some of the same rose bushes, raspberry bushes, and wildflower patches. They were like old friends.

I took an afternoon and walked a wilderness trail along a creek that leads right into the lake. At one point I sat on an old bench covered with moss and lichen, to think. I wasn't there long. A squirrel charged up a tree right next to me and let me know that this was the wrong place, and the wrong time, and I was the wrong person to sit in that spot. I moved on.

Do you ever feel that way? That you might not be doing the right thing at the right time? Many ministers I know would tell you that, while they're studying in their office, they worry that they should be out seeing people, and while they're out seeing people, they worry that they should be studying in their office.

Either that, or the squirrel was mistaken.

I walked a little downstream and found another bench, on a little footbridge over the stream. I found myself thinking about how short life is, how short it really seems for some dear friends who are already looking into etemity.

That's when I felt a nudge in my mind, a thought that sounded like God's voice—"There is always a future. Always."



Homeless and Directionless Find Support

St John's Center in Northern Sri Lanka, which is part of Global Ministries' partner the Church of the American Ceylon Mission, is working with twelve refugee camps which have been home to thousands displaced from their homes due to civil war. St John's has nineteen volunteers, eleven pastors, one doctor and two nurses who are working tirelessly among the camps in a systematic and coordinated way offering subsistence food, child care centers, trauma counseling, medical assistance, clean water and sanitation.



Recently, about three months after the end of the civil war, the Sri Lankan government decided to send 5000 refugees from the outer camps back to their own villages. St John's received about 200 and gave them packages of food and basic clothes to start their new lives. Since their homes were destroyed they will go to live with relatives. The elderly were also released, many have no where to go. St John's is working to accommodate these elders on a temporary basis in elderly facilities.

Over 300,000 people are still in the camps. About 40% of the displaced are children - many of whom are unaccompanied by family members. Their care is the subject of conversations between the government, social agencies and faith groups like St. John's.

Week of Compassion Update:

Floods in Georgia: Rebuilding in Cedar Rapids

September 22, 2009

As Ray Miles, Regional Minister of the Christian Church in Georgia, writes, "What started as an inconvenience and a topic of conversation has escalated in many parts of Georgia to a natural disaster." Homes have been destroyed and some lives lost to the torrential rains. As of now, we do not know of any Disciples churches damaged, though some members of Disciples congregations have been significantly affected. In response Week of Compassion is sending a "solidarity grant" to the Christian Church in Georgia. WoC has also been in touch with the regional ministers and local church pastors in several other states that experienced flooding over the weekend, and so far, there are no reports of other Disciples congregations or members affected.

Week of Compassion is getting ready to team with Church World Service to help plan a 2010 Ecumenical Rebuild Project in <u>Cedar Rapids</u>, <u>lowa</u>, to help with that community's continued flood recovery efforts. This project is only in the planning stages, so please be on the lookout for more details!

Note: Week of Compassion is a year-round ministry, and the needs are year-round. Any time you want to make a contribution, write your check to Eikhart Christian Church, and designate "Week of Compassion" in the note field.


